A	Do not use the present perfect (I have done) when you talk about a finished time (for example, yesterday / ten minutes ago / in 2005 / when I was a child). Use a past tense: It was very cold yesterday. (not has been) Paul and Lucy arrived ten minutes ago. (not have arrived) Did you eat a lot of sweets when you were a child? (not have you eaten) I got home late last night. I was very tired and went straight to bed. Use the past to ask When? or What time?: When did your friends arrive? (not have arrived)

I did a lot of work yesterday. We use the past simple for a finished time in the past. For example: yesterday / last week / from 2007 to 2010.
